The Vice-President of the Republic, Ali Osman Mohammed Taha, has called upon all the governors of northern states and their legislative authorities to concur the legislation issued by the states with the federal ones. Meanwhile, he reiterated that the current constitution will be the same after the referendum whether secession or unity. Taha in a speech delivered before the workshop about the coordination between the laws at the Friendship Hall with the participation of number of the northern

states governors and their legislative organs, stated that the institutions will not be affected by the results of the upcoming Referendum. He stressed the significance of coordination between states and federal laws with the Justice Ministry to avoid contradictions. On his part, the Justice Minister affirmed that the current situation is based on the transitional constitution resulted from the Comprehensive Peace Agreement (CPA). He also added that the Ediscussion should reconsider the changes after the upcoming Referendum.

Egyptian Consul Donates Computers To Journalists Union

Kiir Calls For Meeting Of All Southern Sudan Political Parties

and chairman of the Sudan People's Liberation Movement (SPLM), Salva Kiir Mayardit, has called for a meeting of the southern political leaders on 13 November 2010. Salva Kiir Mayardit speaks on May 6, 2008 in Juba (AFP) A recent 'All Southern Sudan Political Parties Conference' held in Juba, agreed that two meetings of the 'Leadership Council' - consisting of the leaders of all the south's political parties - will meet twice before the region holds a self determination referendum in January. The first meeting will take place on 13 Nov. before registration begins on 14 Nov. while the other one will take place on 8 Jan. 2011 before voting takes place on 9 Jan. In a preparatory meeting held on Tuesday under the chairmanship of the Vice President and Deputy Chairman of SPLM, Riek Machar Teny, the meeting also agreed to identify in the resolutions and

recommendations of the recent conference issues that were of immediate priority before the conduct of the referendum. In a press statement after the meeting, the SPLM Deputy Secretary General for Southern Sector, Ann Itto, said the committee would come up with a matrix and timetable outlining the priority areas

that need to be discussed by the upcoming meeting of the Leadership Council. All the leaders of the southern political parties are expected to attend the leadership meeting. In the recent conference in Juba, all the southern political parties' leaders resolved to put aside their political differences

and embrace reconciliation to work together to achieve the aspirations of the people of Southern Sudan and Abyei through the referenda on 9th January 2011. It is widely expected that the south will vote to become independent in the vote agreed as part of a 2005 peace deal between north and south.

CES Health Min. Appeals For More UNICEF Support

The Minister of Health in Central Equatoria State (CES), Emmanuel Eja, has called on the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) to continue supporting his Ministry in a consolidated effort aimed at improving the health situation in the state. Minister Eja made the remarks yesterday, at the opening of a newly reconstructed Ward at Al Sahaba Children's Hospital. The State Minister also called upon the Government of Southern Sudan (GOSS) to contribute in empowering and capacity building of health workers in the state, which may reduce the high child mortality rate in the region. He congratulated the UNICEF for the

reconstruction of the Hospital and appealed to the staff to maintain the hospital at the best standards. The Minister of Health in GOSS, Hon. Luka Tombekana Monoja, said that his Ministry was ready to collaborate with the State Ministries and the Non Governmental Organization's (NGOs) in improving the health situation in the Country. Monoja encouraged the private sector to also invest in the areas of health. The representative of UNICEF at the function, Mrs. Pelucy Nitamiweri, said that the development of the health sector requires the commitment of the Government to ensure family empowerment in the region. She said that UNICEF will work hard to support to health education in the region and reduce the rate of mortality by 2015 in Southern Sudan.
